EXTREME EVENTS, LOCATIONS AND BRIEF:

WORLD'S HIGHEST GIG:

Where: Nepal 7200m

Extreme Gig: World record for the highest gig.

Why: Since the earthquakes child trafficking has escalated into horrific proportions and communities are still living and learning in the elements. We will visit a few of the sites in and around the epi centres and see the uphill battle these communities face, we'll engage with the street children of Kathmandu and cook them breakfasts. We then move to the centre of Nepal to a remote trek where we jam our way up and down the mountain meeting remote villages along the way and breaking the world record for the highest gig while we're at it.



WORLDS CRAZIEST GIG:

Where: Great Sandy Straight- QLD Australia.

Extreme Gig: Gig on top of an air balloon and a song when freefalling when we jump off.

Why: we are believers in our green futures and here we have a coal mine going under construction with very, very little local consultation. We aren't completely anti coal mine but we ask for 100% assurances in the local surroundings. This site is on the banks of the world famous heritage site Fraser Island. Part of this episode will look into South Australia's ambitious turn to green power which had a huge blackout which gave politicians the ammunition to say we need coal.



RUMBLE INCA JUNGLE:

Where: Amazon, Peru.

Extreme Gig: World record for the longest gig on a raft made by ourselves floating down the Amazon

Why: There's no secret at the speed we are loosing our rainforests. Indigenous tribes are being given back land but they are now 3 generations involved in logging and that's all they know. We have set up a conservation centre in Peru where we hope to train other tribes in eco tourism and sustainable farming. We are hoping to take 5 to 10 indigenous musicians from around the world from different religions and borders and put them together for the trek through the Amazon showing music truly is the international language.

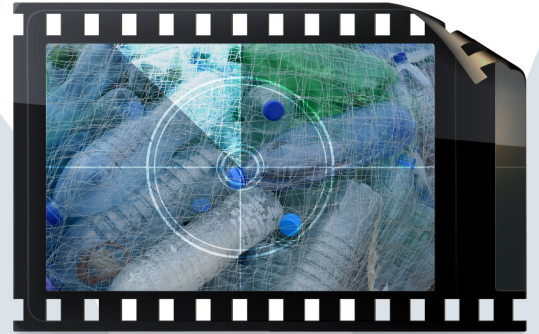
EXTREME EVENTS, LOCATIONS AND BRIEF:

THE PLASTIC SEA:

Where: North Pacific Ocean.

Extreme Gig: Concert on a boat made from plastic floating in the North Pacific gyre.

Why: Plastic has a huge detriment on our environment and nowhere more evident than in the North Pacific Gyre. The largest population of the Albatross are dying from being fed plastic, which has been mistaken for seafood, especially with bright colours. Asia's use of plastics has grown by 1000's of percent in the last 2 decades with very little education on its detriment to the eco system, not just locally but internationally. We will look at alternatives to plastics, education programs, clean up models and what the future has to offer with and without an alternative.



WORLD COLDEST GIG:

Where: Alaska.

Extreme Gig: on an ice berg.

Why: Global warming is something of a debate amongst different options but what is evident is that communities and animals are facing a huge impact on their ways of life. Suicide is at an alarming rate and we will address reasons why it is so high.
